### Introduction


- MSWR has been implementing GAMA SWP with funding from the World Bank since 2015.
  - Over 342,000 beneficiaries of improved household toilets
  - 232,000 school pupils benefiting from improved school toilets
  - Over 368,000 beneficiaries of new water supply connections
- GAMA SWP approach has been adopted by the African Development Bank funded GASLIP project.
- Due to its initial implementation success, GAMA SWP has received additional financing to scale up implementation approach in Greater Kumasi.


#### **FACILITY DELIVERY**

- Subsidy as an incentive for low-income households to own a toilet facility by making it affordable.
- Convenient payment platform for beneficiaries to save towards a toilet in installments.
- Empower MMAs to lead behaviour change campaigns and promotion of household toilets
- Make the MMA a one-stopshop for all sanitation needs especially for low-income areas

- Adopt the BIO-DIGESTER toilet system to circumvent the physical space challenge
- INCENTIVZE large scale service providers to serve the poor
- SUPPORT small scale service providers to scale eg.,
  - Guarantee for loans
  - Fast payment for work done
