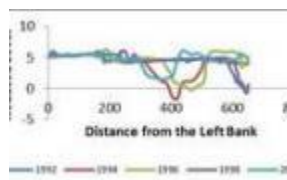

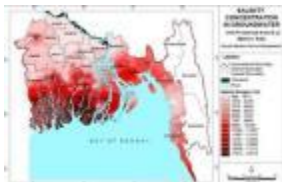
Kick-off action research on saltwater intrusion in Bangladesh
